ABOUT YOU (to share with others while mingling):

You are one of the costumed performers at Ye Olde Renaissance Faire. You play fanfares to announce the opening and closing, the Queen of Beauty's appearances and the start of the jousts. It's a good thing you blow your horn so much, as playing is the only thing that makes you stop talking.

WHAT OTHERS DON'T KNOW ABOUT YOU (keep this secret)

You are the only one who knows in advance the knight who will win, which you communicate through the fanfares you play. You took bribes from the Green Knight to tell him the winners. It was a great deal for you, except he threatened to tell Harda Snales, the Faire owner, that he had been testing you to see if you were corrupt. Since he had proof of the bribes and Harda believed everything he said, now you had to work for him free of charge!
