ABOUT YOU (to share with others while mingling):

WHAT OTHERS DON'T KNOW ABOUT YOU (keep this secret)

You have been taking bribes from gamblers to intentionally lose some jousts you were expected to win. The Green Knight was suspicious, but needed more proof before he could start blackmailing you. Every day he made some snide comment about how he would soon have you in his power. You figured that the only way to end the suspense was to get rid of him...

INTRODUCE YOURSELF AT THE START OF THE GAME BY READING THIS:

Ho there! I am Sky Indigo, known throughout the land as the Blue Knight. And yes, I'm really just a guy who works here, but being the cool, calm Blue Knight is a perfect fit for me. I would have been unhappy if I had to play the sly, dishonest Green Knight.

THE FINAL STATEMENTS

Based on the number on your Who Did It Slip, read your final statement below. If you are innocent, read the INNOCENT paragraph. If you are the murderer, Read the MURDERER paragraph.

AT THE END OF THE GAME READ THE FOLLOWING

If you're INNOCENT, read:

The new system of announcing the winners cut the money I was receiving in bribes, but it also cut off any chance for the Green Knight to blackmail me. So I really had no motive to kill him.

If you're THE MURDERER, read:

Yeah, I did it. He kept hinting that I would be in his power forever, and it made me lose my cool. So I decided to kill him, and I thought that a jousting lance would be poetic justice for a nasty knight. I used my keys to find a good length of broken lance that I could sharpen into a deadly weapon. Then I sneaked backstage when I knew he would be alone, and let him have it.
